To set yourself up to be even more successful next year, we are encouraging you to self-evaluate your 4-H year through this 4-H Youth Record Summary document. This is a unique learning opportunity that allows you to think about and record what you have accomplished during and at the end of the year. Your key leaders can learn more about you and how they can best help you accomplish your goals. Please find that we have combined the Project Record and the Youth Participation Summary into one form. In addition, you no longer need to fill out an individual project record for every project area participated in. Cloverbuds also have their own record summary form.

This record and summary can also be used throughout life in many ways:

- How to set, plan and achieve goals
- Collect and organize information related to building success and lifelong skills
- Accept and complete responsibility and citizenship
- Reflect what you enjoyed, learned, what you could do differently during the year

While completing this form you may find that it helps to talk about what you have done during the year with a leader, another 4-H'er, a parent/guardian, or someone invested in your 4-H participation.
